1. WELCOME AND APOLOGIES

The Chairperson of CATSA welcomed all members to the 2022 AGM in the name of the Society. Apologies for Prof Michael Claeys and Dr Mohamed Fadlalla were noted.

2. CONFIRMATION OF AGENDA

One item, 'Feedback from the Gauteng Catalysis Chapter' was added to the agenda.

3. MATTERS ARISING

No matters arising.

4. CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF 2021 AGM

The draft minutes of the 2021 AGM were proposed by Prof Cornie van Sittert and seconded by Prof Xinyng Liu and are therefore accepted as a true reflection of the 2021 AGM.

5. CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

Prof Fischer thanked the organizing team of the 2022 CATSA conference around Prof John Moma.

Prof Fischer thanked the CATSA Committee for their work over the previous year and especially the former chairperson Prof Cornie van Sittert for steering the Society through the COVID pandemic and Prof Marilé Landman for serving the Society as treasurer.

The passing of the CATSA committee member Dr Rehana Malgas-Enus was commemorated.

CATSA provided travel grants to four students to attend the North American Catalysis Society meeting in New York and the International Conference on Coordination Chemistry in Rimini, Italy. Scientific work was presented in form of two posters and three oral presentations. In addition, one student was supported to attend an EFCATS summer school in Albi, France. The Society supported a further 39 students with grants to attend the 2022 CATSA conference.

Prof Fischer highlighted the 2022 CATSA Eminent Visitor Prof Charles Sykes from Tufts University, USA, as well as the 2022 CATSA Lifetime Achievement Awardee Prof Jack Fletcher form UCT.

CATSA is a full member of the European Federation of Catalysis Societies as well as the International Association of Catalysis Societies with Prof Holger Friedrich and Prof Nico Fischer representing the Society on these international councils. Both EFCATS and IACS are restarting their conference series and the next EuropaCAT conference will be held in 2023 in Prague and the next International Congress on Catalysis will be held in Lyon, France, in 2024. For the latter Prof Fischer is serving on an inaugural Ethics Committee. The awards presented by EFCATS were shown highlighting the EFCATS Best PhD Thesis Award. For this CATSA will publish a call as each national society is invited to submit one nomination. The YEuCat (www.youngcatalysis.net) group was highlighted and young researchers invited to join this network.

Within South Africa the fourth international Syngas Convention to be held in Cape Town in April 2023 was highlighted.

The report was proposed by Prof Xinyng Liu and seconded by Prof Eric van Steen.

6. TREASURER'S REPORT

Prof Marilé Landman presented the Treasurer's Report. In the 2021/22 Financial Year, CATSA collected an income of R136 388, significantly higher that the budgeted R80 000. This was mainly achieved through a change in investments accounts increasing the interest on assets, a higher-than-expected participation at the 2021 online conference as well as some student travel award refunds. The income is opposed by expenditure of R78 939 (budgeted R34 750). The higher expenditure is mostly driven by R24 499 of debt accumulated over several years that was now written off. By the end of February 2022, the CATSA accounts showed a total balance of R2 129 807.95.

The 2022/23 budget balances income of R291 759 with an expected expenditure of R275 000. On the income side R164 759 resulted from the 2021 virtual CATSA conference which is much more than anticipated and a great achievement by the team of Prof Ojwach. The expenditure is mostly driven by national and international travel grants (four oral and four poster awards) as well as the 2023 Eminent Visitor award.

The report was proposed by Prof Cornie van Sittert and seconded by Prof Linda Jewell.

7. MEDIA OFFICER'S REPORT

Prof John Moma presented the report on behalf of Dr Rehana Malgas-Enus. Prof Moma presented the website and newsletter of the Society and requested content submissions by the membership. Social media platforms include Facebook, Linkedin, Instagram and Twitter and are maintained. Sponsors are now also invited to advertise on these channels according to a new conference sponsorship protocol.

8. STUDENT REPRESENTATIVES'S REPORT

Mr Zama Duma reported on the activities of the CATSA Student Committee and introduced the committee members, which managed the Society's Twitter account and organized the SASOL-sponsored kahoot! Quiz amongst others.

Prof Selwyn Mapolie highlighted the absence of UCT and WITS representatives and urged students to take the opportunity and to contribute to the Society.

9. CONFERENCE 2021 REPORT

Prof Stephen Ojwach provided a brief report on the 2021 virtual CATSA conference. The conference had a total of 219 delegates, with 130 students and 9 international delegates and with that surpassed expectations significantly. Prof Stephen Ojwach thanked his organizing committee to support the efforts. The Eminent Visitor was Prof Paul Chirik from Princeton University, USA, who might visit South Africa in 2023.

Prof Fischer conveyed the Society's thanks to Prof Ojwach as well as the loyal sponsors that continue to support CATSA.

10. CONFERENCE 2022 ORGANISER'S INTERIM REPORT

Prof John Moma reported that the conference attracted 272 on site delegates with an additional 26 virtual delegates (55% being students). Prof Moma thanked his organizing committee as well as the sponsors supporting the event.

11. CONFERENCE 2023 UPDATE

Prof Eric van Steen presented the plans to host the 2023 CATSA conference at the Diaz Hotel in Mossel Bay from 5 to 8 November. The committee aims to keep the cost for student registrations as low as possible to maximize attendance.

12. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

No further items were raised.

13. FEEDBACK FROM THE GAUTENG CATALYSIS CHAPTER

Prof Xinying Liu reported on a new initiative amongst some catalysis research groups in Gauteng organizing regular symposia providing a platform for student presentations and networking. Approximately 60 attendees were present at the first event with some additional via an online platform. It will be attempted to run this event more regularly.
